### Teams and Cars

The first step in this project is the formation of the school racing team – see later details.

This project is a wonderful opportunity for children to get hands on experience on mechanical construction, use computer skills to obtain valuable information from the USA, and apply practical graphic art skills for car preparation in conjunction with sponsors.

Most of you will still have your cars from last year – most will need work, new sponsors signage, etc

One of the rules in Soap Box racing is that the drivers and crew must be able to assemble their own car so we recommend that you completely dismantle and rebuild your cars checking for damage and replacing parts as required.

## The School Teams

Each school should have a team of 8, consisting of 4 drivers, 2 reserve drivers who will act as Pit Crew, and 2 other Pit Crew. All teams must also have a staff member or parent who can transport the cars.

On race day each of the school's four drivers will race at least twice.



### AGE LIMITS!!

- No younger than 10 years old as at 21<sup>st</sup> March 2010
- No older than 17 years old as at 1<sup>st</sup> August 2010

## The Cars and Spare Parts

- If you need any spare parts please contact Lyn.
- Please return any broken parts that you have as we can often get these repaired.
- Parts may be picked up at 570 Swanson Road, Ranui (see Lyn around the back)

Teams should liaise with sponsors regarding painting and signage.

- Schools generally are expected to find someone within their group to prepare and paint the cars (some use computer graphics to produce a cool car!)
- Sponsors are expected to provide stick on vinyl logos and signage as per rules.
- Rotary will provide numbers, sponsors signage as required so don't be afraid to give last years car a makeover.

## Practise Track

We will organize a practice track somewhere in West Auckland for use in the week leading up to the race day.

- This will be available on the weekend before and also in the evenings. This may help determine the final list of drivers
- On these days you will be able to have the cars tested, get the car and driver weights right, and have trial runs on the starting ramp.
- These practices will be from around 4pm to 7pm and is a great opportunity to fine tune your cars and have a lot of fun with your families. In the past many families have made it a picnic event.
- For safety reasons it is important that every driver must have several practice runs to ensure they have full control of steering and braking systems.
- **This should be done slowly at first on gentle slopes building up to speed only when confident**
- If you can't make your car go in an absolutely straight line you have no chance of winning. Also you must be able to stop the car in less than 50 metres after getting up to 50km per hour.
- Crash helmets and sensible clothing must be used during practice as well as when racing.
