Hospice



WAITAKERE CITY ROTARY 2010 TREES FOR SURVIVAL REPORT

Waitakere City Rotary Club sponsors two Schools in the Trees for Survival programme, Matipo School and TeAtatu School.

In the last twelve months The Club has assisted with:

- Planting day for each school by providing transport in the form of a bus.
- Also provided the Trees for Survival Programme with assistance on three occasions with deliveries of seedlings and potting mix to six schools.

The Trees for Survival Propagating Units at the schools teaches children how to nurture plants and then the experience of planting them to help the environment. They learn the reason behind preventing erosion, controlling the runoff water and providing natural habitat for birds etc. Last but not least how areas can be changed into visibly attractive places that help everyone.

It is of interest that the children in the Trees for Survival Programme over the years have this year planted the one millionth tree.

Let's hope that with our continued support this number will continue to grow and our young will encouraged to protect their environment.

International Report - 2009-2010

An amazing year for those who took part and a success story for Waitakere Rotary to be proud of.

Kerry, Heather, Alan and Craiger went back again to Bongabonga Village in June 2009 to complete the First Aid Station. A hard week saw them complete everything to a very high standard. The week before our arrival a huge earthquake shook the island and ruined most water tanks and left the main hospital unusable.



Quick decisions and fast work with the villagers joining in saw two water tanks delivered, installed and filled with water in 3 days, crisis averted and a story the village will tell for years to come.

Our main goal, to finish the Aid Station, then became more urgent as our little village would now be responsible for the majority of the medical needs for much of the island. Once finished, dignitaries from all over Vanuatu came to celebrate the opening.



Waitakere City handed over the keys to the Chief Health officer for Vanuatu and the next day the nurse had her first patient.

The trip home was dangerous, took forever and left us beaten; battered and bruised, worthy of a movie but that is another entirely different story!

May 2010 saw Craiger, Kerry and Phil-from-New Lynn head back to the island to repair the Bongabonga Village main tank and once again the villagers came to watch, help and learn new skills from the Kiwis. Another great trip with a totally successful outcome.


