Massey Matters was born 5 years ago with promised funding by Waitakere City Council for 10 years. The Council amalgamation has changed this to funding through next year with no word as yet to following years.

Their goal is to build a sense of community within their area through many low cost schemes.

In May they will be holding “**Our Amazing Place Treasure Hunt**” and Linda came to tell us all about it.

Two of these have been held so far in Pt Chevalier (2009) and McLaren Park (2010). This year it is Massey’s turn.

Participants will sort themselves out into teams and be given a map to follow with various “stations” along the way to check out different activities. Some people may choose to walk, others to ride bikes. Some may choose to do the entire route, others a partial one. Whatever people choose to do the goal is to meet with others, bring the kids and to have FUN.

It is still very much in the planning stages but ideas for Stations that have been used in the past include:

- Tea with the Lions at a Retirement Village (again Pt Chev)
- Visiting gardens
- Checking out Parks
- Stands for various community groups
- ...

At each of the Stands participants will gain a stamp for their check sheet (or answer a question). Those who complete at least 12 stations will then go into the draw for prizes at the end.

Ideas for Helping:

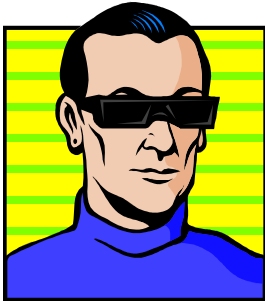
- Logistics support

Notice for Club Presidents and Secretaries - Standard Club Constitution changes - As a result of the 2010 Council On Legislation, the Standard Club Constitution has changed. In accordance with Rotary's Constitutional Documents all Clubs are deemed to have adopted the revised Constitution. However, the Incorporated Societies Act requires any changes to the Constitution to be properly authorised by the Club and filed with the Registrar of Incorporated Societies. It is more convenient to replace the old Constitution with the new one. It should be appreciated that the R.I. approved N.Z. version of the Standard Club Constitution is significantly different to the Standard Club Constitution that can be downloaded from the RI website and that version should not be used as it does not meet local legal requirements. Documentation has been sent to all club Presidents and Secretaries and when filed with the Registrar of Incorporated Societies each club should advise the District Administrator. Any queries in connection with the above should be directed to the District 9910 Legislation And Resolution Committee members, PDG Neil Reid or PDG David Oliver as per page 42 of the 2010 - 2011 District 9910 Directory.

Notice for Club Presidents and Secretaries - Club Charitable Trust changes - All clubs have been forwarded Charities Act Forms 3 and 4. Form 3 is for Notification Of Changes To Charitable Entity which should be used to notify the Charities Commission of any changes to your Charitable Trust. Any changes should be notified to the Charities Commission within three months of the change. This will include changes to the Trustees of the Trust. Form 4 is the Annual Return for a Charitable Entity. This Form should be filed with The Charities Commission no later than six months after balance date. The Charities Commission encourages you to complete and file this document online and it certainly is financially beneficial to do so. The manual filing fee is \$76.67 whereas the online filing fee is \$51.11. However, if your charities gross annual income is less than \$10,000 no fee is payable but you still have to file the annual return. Each club should advise the District Administrator as soon as they consider that the Charities Commission Register for their Club's Trust is up to date.
