REMINDER - Help Rotary funds through USave - Rotarians throughout New Zealand are being asked to consider an alternative to buying or selling through Trade Me. A new system called USave has

been set up and is donating 25% of its commission on sales to charities.

The key here is that Rotarians must nominate Rotary in NZ. Ken Linkhorn, treasurer of NZCAP (Rotary's NZ Corporate Alliance Programme), says the first \$10 is in the bank following the agreement between NZCAP and USave.

Like other schemes (electricity and telephone use for example), USave will generate more money for Rotary every time it is used by someone nominating Rotary in NZ. So, go to www.usavemoney.co.nz, register and name Rotary in NZ as your charity. The next time you go to sell something, use USave. And pass the message on to friends and family.
