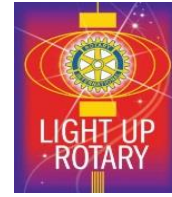

Waitakere Rotary Learn to Ride Track.....Progress to date (September)



This idea was mooted at the change over and the project has progressed since then.

The aim is to build a learn to ride track similar to below to help the young children learn about road safety and to understand what signs such as Give Way, Stop, One Way and pedestrian crossings, are all about. Along with some road sense. This would be aimed at 3 -7 year olds. We envisage it as a nice way for families to be positively enjoying time

together.

Four Rotarians, Joy, Gus, Luke and Alan met with the Council on Tuesday and the council have offered us the area on the other side of the playground in Paremuka reserve.

We have applied for a matching grant through Rotary International and understand it has hit "the short list".

The picture below is a Learn to Ride Track next to the velodrome in Cambridge. It contains some of the aspects that will be incorporated. The learn to ride area would be in the shape of a Rotary wheel.

We have spoken to the neighbours most affected and they were positive about the idea. So next is to satisfy the council requirements so we can proceed.
