

GLEN EDEN Lucinda Place Community Orchard

Lucinda Place Community Orchard is nestled beside the Waikumete Stream in Glen Eden. Amongst a few old heritage fruit trees are 30 or so 2-3 year old trees planted with the support of Project Twin Streams Glen Eden. There are plum, apple, peach, feijoa, citrus, macadamia and persimmon all under-planted with various companions. The orchard is cared for without the use of chemicals. Scythes are used to mow the orchard. Community run working bees are every 6 weeks. There are a range of people from experts to beginners who are passionate about growing food.

Bishop Stream Neighbourhood Garden has been going for 3 years. The raised beds are individually owned and we have developed common areas where we grow herbs and other vegetables. We also have fruit trees growing down the slope below the beds.


Our water comes from Bishop Stream and is piped into our water barrels by gravity feed, a truly marvellous system that has kept us going all through the dry summer.

We don't have a co-ordinator as we work as a team with regular working bees.

The aim of our garden is two-fold: to have a supply of fresh organically grown food and to create a sense of community in our neighbourhood.



Millbrook Edible Garden

(MEG) sits in parkland adjacent to a public walkway which is used extensively for recreational activities. The garden has been open for over four years. It is a community component of Project Twin Streams, organised under the McLaren Park Henderson South ([MPHS](#)) Community Initiative.

Although the number of volunteers is small the garden it is well regarded within the neighbourhood. Most of the area is gardened in common, though three groups do maintain individual plots, as well as participating in the larger garden.

The common plots are used to produce a limited range of easy-to-maintain crops. This approach has proven popular with the general public, who are invited to harvest at will - and to help in the gardens.


RANUI

Jadewynn Drive Gardens


