



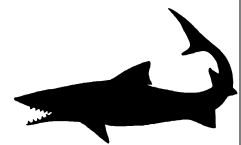

Club Service: John Ritchie

- The Club Service team act as policemen within Rotary to ensure we follow the rules. They have asked that all directors who have not done so put in their 12 month plans to the Board.

Youth: Heather Pattison

- I've been so busy with soapbox derbies lately that I haven't caught up with a lot of things - including youth projects.
- We brought Rosemary up-to-date with things we have been involved in over the last few months.

Vocational: Ross Ward

The committee have come up with 4 proposals for vocational visits for the next year:

- Visit the Hobsonville Marine Cluster of Businesses
- Contact John Wadsworth and see if we can work with Waitakere Enterprise to use the new motorway for a fund raising dinner
- See if we can arrange a trip round Douglas Pharmaceuticals
- See if it possible to visit the Shortland Street set

International: Craiger Hargesheimer

- Plans for Tongoa are on hold till we discover whether the NZ High Commission will provide funding
- We have raised a couple of thousand
- Craiger has been in contact with the Kerikeri Club. They may be willing to donate \$2,500 to the project along with 2 people
- There are half a dozen people willing to go on the next trip
- Time commitments mean the next trip may be in June or July

Community:

Kumeu River Project:

- ARC gave a grant to cover plants, labour and pest control
- This hasn't covered all of the expenses. The Community committee will fundraise to cover the shortfall
- David is to approach Rodney Council, Kumeu Rotary and the Lions for assistance

Literacy Program:

- Between the Casino evening, the John Key lunch and a donation from the Chenery Trust, the Community Committee should have a donation towards this program of around \$5,000 by the end of the Rotary year.

A couple of their plumbers may be able to help on Tongoa and they may also be able to find sponsorship from their suppliers for plumbing materials.
