Rotary and I: Mike Angland



Mike started life on a farm outside Dannevirke and became an expert on milking cows at the age of 7 when his Dad contracted cancer. Due to a slight shortage of school buses the mailman dropped him to school at 11:30am and picked him up for the return home at 1:30pm.

When he was nine his Dad died and life was rather rough for a couple of years. Living in a barn without running water, power or other mod cons isn't everyone's cup of tea. A shift to a state house in Dannevirke was a significant lifestyle improvement.



At 15 school ended and Mike took up an apprenticeship in Napier learning carpentry and joinery. Work in the carpentry area dropped off and joinery took over. This led, via staircases to ceilings and eventually self employment with Angland Ceilings.

During the apprenticeship days, with an income of £3 6s 8p per week - and rent of £3 - Mike bought a bass guitar and this led to all sorts of fun.

Mike played with "Johnny and the Contacts" and then with "Max Merritt and the Meteors" at The Top Hat - a dance hall in Napier.



During one of their 3 or 4 tours of the country they ended up with The Beatles in Dunedin. This in the days of Beetle Mania. On one occasion they stood in for The Beatles – coats up round their ears they drove off in limousines flanked by police cars and surrounded by hoards of screaming teenagers. The Beatles in the meantime quietly slipped out the back door for a bit of peace.

In 1965 the time for bands came to an end with marriage, and later the Mustang gave way to three kids.



Graham Maddren was the first one to suggest joining Rotary (but he was a bit unclear about it all and Mike thought he meant Lions). Sometime later Don Page set him straight and got him along to Rotary with Derek. That was back in 1992 and he's been a member ever since. And a regular sponsor of the SBD
