

- This year Shawn has been of invaluable help to all the race centres and teams and the races are going from strength to strength
- <At our rain date derby Shawn's managed 3 major tasks simultaneously as we had insufficient manpower due to the change of date!>

He is also the Riverhead Scout Leader and has helped many children over many years.

For his dedicated involvement and help to all the teams with the Soapbox Derby over the last 10 years, and the time he puts into other community affairs such as Scouts, it was my absolute pleasure to welcome our newest Paul Harris Fellow - Shawn Dyer

And Shawn? For the first time since I met him through Soapbox Derby he was rendered almost speechless!

This year's Derby proved "interesting". Despite being rained off we managed to get ourselves onto National TV twice (Breakfast TV and the Erin Simpson Show) and three schools came up with videos.
