

Swanson at the Soapbox Derby

Sunday, 21st March, Westgate Drive, Massey



The Waitakere City Rotary Club, with key sponsors The Trusts and the Trusts Charitable Foundation, once again organised the popular Waitakere soapbox derby. Cars are all built to a standard design, and 76 West Auckland school children aged between 10 and 16, raced these down Westgate Drive on the day. Speeds reached 55km per hour (speed cameras clocked them) and racing was "intense", according to Project Manager Heather Pattison. Those going through to the next round were from Riverhead and Waitakere Primary Schools.

TV cameras on the day were from a German crew as well as from the makers of "Radar's Patch" on TV One. Episode 6 is scheduled to air on May 9 although this is yet to be confirmed, and will feature the derby and especially Shawn Dyer of Riverhead School.

The paint job done by Redwood Panel & Paint was flawless with the signage making the car look fantastic. The Swanson School car was nominated for 'Best Looking Car'.

Dylan Foley was awarded 'best control after a crash', but luckily this occurred on the last run of the day so the car had done its job, although it did end up sacrificing its axle.

The parent and community support on the day was appreciated. Special thanks to Chris Harrison for his technical expertise between races.

Swanson School team was proud to drive the 'mussel car' on the day. We look forward to carrying this on next year. Sponsors of the Swanson team, Future Cuisine and Redwood Panel and Paint, are delighted to be involved with a project supporting the school their own children attend or have attended.

A brand new derby car body gave Darren Harvey the opportunity to test out the new "zirallic" pearl automotive coating system in Redwood Panel and Paint's bake oven. This is a complex 3-stage system including base coat (in Swanson's case, black), then the liquid pearls, then a clear top coat that brings out the special effects.

"A lot of care is required to achieve such a specialised finish," says Darren. "It was great that paint suppliers PPG backed us and the school



as well – the zirallic coating alone is worth \$1,000 per litre!"



Joe Kouwenhoven, Managing Director of Future Cuisine, had only two weeks to decide but says, "in the end it was an easy decision." Future Cuisine Racing already sponsors Hans Boere's speedway sprint car and Tim Pipes' mini, and supports quad bike racing and practice on land at Bethells. As Future Cuisine he supports the RSA fishing club and other local events.

Both sponsors enjoy supporting their community, and feel the community supports them in return. "It's important to give something back," they say.
