21 years ago a couple of nurses saw a real need for early nursing assistance in the community and set out to fill it. WONS was born and over time has evolved into a business model and now employs 31 staff members.

Partial funding comes from contracts with the DHB and Ministry of Health but extra fundraising is required to fulfil all the needs.

So what do WONS do?


WONS is a charitable trust committed to working with and assisting the community and other service providers to keep our women and their families well.

For a great many women, particularly in lower income areas, getting to the Doctor for a health check is an unaffordable luxury. WONS has therefore stepped in to take health checks into the community Free of Charge.

Health checks are run in various places all over town. Workplaces, churches, maraes, supermarkets... Where there is a need the WONS team try to be there.

Originally a massage table and a suitcase were packed into a station wagon and taken to these various locations. These days they have more equipment and are currently fund raising for a new van.

We haven't received any applicants to date. Does anyone know of a suitable candidate who would benefit from this?



VANUATU NEWS

WHANGAREI SOUTH ROTARY CLUB PRESS ARTICLE

Reopening school a moving experience







And during renovations

The opportunity to join a Rotary aid party to Tongoa Island in Vanuatu was jumped at - and resulted in a challenging and most rewarding experience for a Whangarei Rotarian Laurie Young. Vanuatu is one of the three Pacific Island territories comprising part of our Rotary District 9910.

The May 2009 earthquake that hit Vanuatu resulted in damage to 80% of the water tanks on Tongoa. With no rivers on Tongoa the 14 villages rely heavily on the significant Pacific rainfall so the Rotary Clubs of Waitakere City and New Lynn have contributed valuable assistance in remedying damaged and replacing some of the water tanks on the Island.

In addition the 50 pupil 2 roomed Hiwelo School was declared a Disaster Zone and closed. For the past 18 months the children have been having lessons on the floor of the three roomed house supposed to be occupied by the teacher.

The damage was not structural however, consisting of cracked concrete columns, walls and floor. Rotary dispatched an engineer to scope the damage and assess the repairs needed. His report was submitted to the Vanuatu Department of Education and with liaison with the Rotary Club of Port Vila. galvanized steel plates were fabricated in New Zealand and shipped over with steel cable, framing timber, corrugated iron, cement, plumbing materials and paint, in preparation for a team of Rotarians to visit. Work demands in New Zealand (significantly the Canterbury earthquake) prevented the originators of the project from making the trip. Assistance was therefore obtained from fellow Rotarians, mainly from Whangaparaoa Rotary Club, hence an opportunity for a lucky Whangarei Rotarian to join them.

The Hilwelo School serves two villages Bongabonga and Meriu, about two kilometers apart in very steep terrain, so, the work was undertaken with a large team of the local Nivan people oprganised by the local school teacher. Because of thorough planning and preparation a lot was achieved. About 40 plates were bolted to the concrete structure, broken concrete and floor cracks were filled and ground smooth, the roof, the exterior and interior were painted. Having no windows the push-out shutters were in significant need of repair as was the 2m x2m x3m concrete water tank that was cracked and empty. Steel cable bracing was installed and the tank ground smooth and lined with a double liner and mosquito proof roof constructed. A new toilet was built in a more appropriate location and water piped so the children could wash their hands.

There being no electricity (apart from a small generator, run when they have petrol) the team took over a solar energy panel, regulator and inverter donated by the Rotary Club of Whangarei South which, with ancillary equipment enables the school to now run a DVD and two halogen lamps, one above the teacher's desk in each room. Cell phones operated through a Chinese constructed network, are a valuable means of communication in this isolated part of the world, can also be charged. Other gifts donated by Rotarians taken to Tongoa were a battery operated blood pressure monitor for the nearby Aid Station, a used laptop computer, carving tools, football jerseys, a box of bras, embroidery material, sundry tools and food items plus materials for the school and gifts for use as rewards at the school.

The Official Opening was a large, elaborate and quite moving affair, reflecting the significance to the two communities, of the work accomplished.

Not one of the eight members of the Rotary party could have avoided being affected by the emotion of the occasion as teachers, parents, Chiefs, Pastors and children and fellow and neighbouring villagers rejoiced in the accomplishments and all shared the joy and satisfaction of being part of a cooperative effort of Rotary in Action.

WHANGAREI SOUTH ROTARY CLUB BULLETIN

The following is an extract from their Bulletin. (Laurie also apologized for the lack of mention of the other Clubs involved in this – like Kerry from our Club who organized it all)

LAURIE'S WORKING VISIT TO HIWELO SCHOOL ON TONGOA ISLAND, VANUATU.

Apart from the physical work undertaken, gifts donated by Rotarians taken to Tongoa Island by Laurie included a battery-operated blood pressure monitor for the nearby Aid Station, a used laptop computer, carving tools, football jerseys, a box of bras, embroidery material, sundry tools and food items plus school supplies.

The Official Opening of the restored school building, catering for 50 students from 2 neighbouring villages, was a large, elaborate and moving affair, reflecting the significance to the two villages of the work accomplished. Teachers, parents, Chiefs, Pastors, children and neighbouring villagers rejoiced in the accomplishments and all shared the joy and satisfaction of being part of a cooperative effort of Rotary in Action. The success of the mission was largely determined by the detailed planning and preparation that had gone into it.

<u>Summary of Main Work Programme carried out by the team of 8 Rotarians, aided by local</u> islanders.

Repair earthquake damage to school to make safe. Drill 400 x 12mm holes to depth of 100mm; bolt 50 prefabricated steel plates to cracked concrete beams and columns; repair concrete floor; replace rusted

roofing iron; repaint building exterior; repair shutters.

Repair water tank cracked by earthquake. Bind tank with steel cables; line with polythene; install mosquito proof cover; plumb for new water supply to toilet tap.

<u>Construct toilet in new location.</u> Relocate ½ tonne concrete toilet throne – 20 islanders hauled the throne up one gully then lowered down another; construct building and clad with woven palm leaf matting; install water stand for hand-washing.

<u>Install solar power unit.</u> This was donated by Whangarei South Rotary, to augment petrol-generator to provide lighting over teachers' desks, power for chargers for laptop and cell phones.

Deliver donated goods.

These included a laptop computer, wood carving tools, rugby jerseys, bras, school supplies, etc.


